B. Prerequisites

Basic knowledge of the principles of law in statutory and common law countries.

Aims of education

The aim of this subject is to introduce selected problems of public law in Europe. The program will be shaped depending on the subject raised by the visiting professor. For the subject of personal data protection, the aim of the course will be to familiarize students with the practical aspects of the European model of personal data protection.

Course contents

Program content of the issue of personal data protection in the European Union as an example of a selected problem of public law in Europe: Privacy v. personal data; Background and purposes of the data protection reform in EU; Results of harmonisation of the European data protection law and its impact on Polish law; Legal basis of privacy and data protection; Data processing; Territorial scope; Principles of data protection; Principles relating to processing of personal data; Lawfulness of processing; Consent; Processing of special categories of personal data; Processing which does not require identification; Anonymisation and pseudonymisation, Rights of the data subject; Access; Rectification and erasure; Right to data portability; Automated individual decision-making; Profiling; Controller and processor; Data protection by design and by default; Records of processing activities; Security of personal data; Notification of a personal data breach; Data protection impact assessment and prior consultation; Data protection officer; Codes of conduct and certification; Transfers of personal data to third countries or international organisations; Binding corporate rules; International cooperation for the protection of personal data; Independent supervisory authorities; Cooperation between the lead supervisory authority and the other supervisory authorities concerned; Consistency mechanism; European Data Protection Board; Right to an effective judicial remedy; Right to compensation and liability; Administrative fines; Technological challenges; Internet of Things, Artificial Intelligence; Social networks.
